



The 2015 Medieval Fighting Team ESTONIA 1 combines the joint forces of three clubs in Estonia, each based in a different city – Tallinn, Tartu and Narva.

The members of the team were chosen at the Estonian Medieval Fighting Championship, held on 28 March 2015 in Viljandi.

The members elected Ivan Gremov (Karu Klubi, Narva) as the captain of their team.

The team ESTONIA 1 represents Estonia in the 2015 international competitions, including the IMCF Medieval Combat World Championship 2015 held in Malbork and the HMBIA Battle of the Nations held in Prague.



The Medieval Fighting Team ESTONIA 1 is represented by the Estonian Historical Fencing Association.

Estonian Historical Fencing Association is a nonprofit organization that unites the majority of historical fighting clubs in Estonia (6 clubs in 2015). The main goal of Estonian Historical Fencing Association is developing sportive historical fighting in Estonia, uniting the Estonian historical fighting clubs and representing them abroad. The founders of the organization have also arranged historical fencing tournaments in Estonia since 2006.

In 2014, Estonian Historical Fencing Association took part in preparing and taking the Estonian National Team to the World Championship in HMB, Battle of the Nations.

In 2015, Estonian Historical Fencing Association organized the first open Estonian Medieval Fighting Championship in Viljandi.

Estonian Medieval Fighting Championshiop 2015

On 28 March 2015, the Estonian Historical Fencing Association organized the first open Estonian Medieval Fighting Championship, which was held in Viljandi. The championship hosted 28 fighters from Estonia, Latvia and Israel.

Based on the championship results, the 2015 Estonian National Team was formed. Buhurt 5vs5 team Sõdalaste Koda (clubs Karu Klubi, Turm, Soldknechte, captain Ivan Gremov) became Team ESTONIA 1 and Buhurt 5vs5 team Nordburg (club Nordburg, captain Nikolai Bõkov) became Team ESTONIA 2. Duellist Jaan Murumets became Estonia's Fighter no.1 in the Duel 1vs1 category.
